Safety First!

Air-Acetylene Equipment

Follow these safety precautions when working with air-acetylene equipment:

- Keep a fire extinguisher handy.
- Wear safety glasses and goggles.
- Keep cylinders away from heat, sparks or open flames.
- Always stand to one side when adjusting the regulator. A defective regulator can blow out and cause injury.
- Never adjust the regulator above 15 psig. Acetylene becomes unstable at excessive pressures.
- Store and transport cylinders in an upright cart or in a secured upright position.
- Do not open the valve on an tank more than 1-1/2 turns.

Brazing and Soldering Fumes

Brazing and soldering alloys and fluxes may produce fumes which are hazardous to your health.

Keep these safety tips in mind:

- Keep your head away from the fumes.
- Provide adequate ventilation to keep fumes and gases from your breathing zone and the general area.
- Always wear correct eye, ear and body protection.

Brazed/Soldered Components

When replacing system components that are brazed or soldered in a system, it is normally safer to cut out the original component rather than unbraze or unsolder it from the system.

The reason for this recommendation is that oil may be present inside the joint of the component that is being removed. Heating the joint can cause the oil to ignite, and

potentially cause injury.

When cutting the component out of the system, do so at an easily accessible location. Once the component is removed from the system, transfer the remaining stubs from the old component to the new component and then braze or solder the complete assembly back into the system.

Fire Extinguishers

When brazing or soldering refrigeration tubing, it is wise to

keep a fire extinguisher within a reachable distance. This is especially true when working in a confined area or an oily location.

A small portable fire extinguisher is normally ideal for most repairs. Be sure to inspect the fire extinguisher to make sure it is still okay to use. Having a non

-working fire extinguisher is like having no fire extinguisher at all.

Even though extinguishers come in a number of shapes and sizes, they all operate in a similar manner. Here's an easy acronym for use:

PASS -- Pull, Aim, Squeeze and Sweep

Pull the pin at the top of the extinguisher that keeps the handle from being accidentally pressed.

<u>Aim</u> the nozzle toward the base of the fire.

To operate an extinguisher:

Pull
Aim
Squeeze
Sweep

Squeeze the handle to discharge the

extinguisher and stand approximately 8 feet away from the fire. If you release the handle, the discharge will stop.

Sweep the nozzle back and forth at the base of the fire.
